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DIVING & DOLPHINS AWAIT IN ROATAN

At Anthony's Key Resort, dive the second largest barrier reef, encounter dolphins in a natural lagoon and relax in the new freshwater pool hidden by palms in the middle of a small private atoll.

Thirty-five miles off the coast of Honduras, Anthony's Key Resort (AKR) dive boats cruise the crystal waters of the Bay Islands, skimming over the world's second largest barrier reef en route to world-class diving. With the largest and most modern fleet of custom built dive boats in the Caribbean, guests of Anthony's Key Resort have a choice of hundreds of sites, with 35 sites 5-30 minutes away on a vibrant reef, in tepid warm waters averaging 80-100 feet visibility.



Accommodations are stunning, as guests enjoy their own private island with white-sand beaches leading to stilted bungalows over jade-colored waters. Dense and colorful tropical foliage abounds and sunsets are some of the best the Caribbean has to offer.

AKR owns and operates a unique on-site research and educational facility with the only dolphin program in Honduras, the Roatan Institute of Marine Sciences (RIMS). Dolphins reside in a natural lagoon, complete with a living coral reef ecosystem, and leave the facility to interact with snorkelers and divers in myriad dolphin activities.



The family-owned and operated all-inclusive resort gets everyone into the water with dolphin encounters in waist deep waters, SCUBA Discovery Camp for kids and dolphin training sessions at the natural lagoon on property.

As a PADI 5-Star Gold Palm Resort, AKR offers the least expensive diver training and PADI certification in the Caribbean and runs a PADI Instructor Development Center. The on-site medical facility, serving residents and visitors, includes a hyperbaric chamber.

For an island day trip, guests can visit Gumbalimba Park, clip into rock climbing equipment and rush through jungle treetops

across zip lines like a secret agent. Overnight excursions to mainland Honduras are available to tour ancient Copan Ruins, visit working coffee plantations, soak in hot springs, horseback ride through verdant valleys to Mayan fertility sites, hike through a cloud forest in Pico Bonito National Park and much more.

WHAT'S NEW

New to the resort this summer is a 30 by 60-foot in ground swimming pool located in the middle of Anthony's Key, hidden among towering palms and a short walk from stilted bungalows on the perimeter of the secluded eight acre island. The 6,000 gallon freshwater pool is perfect for swimming laps or relaxing after a day's adventure on built-in seating along the perimeter, or in lounge chairs at the pool's edge. Guests can hop out for a cold drink or snack from the new bar and grill and stay late (until 10 p.m.) for star gazing.

ROOMS

There are 56 individual bungalows, some with or without air conditioning. Ten wooden cabanas are tastefully tucked into the lush, forested hillside overlooking a sparkling lagoon and a garden view setting. The other 46 bungalows are just a 60 second boat ride to the small private island of Anthony, where the ocean front bungalows surround the island's perimeter some sitting over the crystal blue waters on stilts.

These rooms offer each their own private bathroom with hot water, 2 double or 1 king bed, ceiling fan (with or without air conditioning) and a private or shared porch with hammock for relaxation.



A 60-second boat ride ferries guests to the small private island of Anthony, whose perimeter holds ocean front bungalows, some sitting over crystal blue waters on stilts.

Bailey's Key is a two-minute boat ride west of Anthony's Key, where inquisitive visitors can wade waist-deep into the lagoon and interact with dolphins from the Roatan Institute of Marine Sciences.

In keeping with the slow pace of island life, there are no TVs, phones, clocks or internet access in the individual bungalows. There is satellite TV at the Frangipani Bar and wireless internet service is available anywhere on property if guests bring a laptop.

Beyond the world-class dive sites, Roatan has much to offer above the surface of the ocean. There are horses to ride on the beaches, kayaks to paddle around its shores, fly fishing on the flats and dolphins to play with in the surf.

RIMS is also home to the Roatan Museum, displaying artifacts and exhibits of the culture and history of the Bay Islands
