CLOSE TO HOME New Forest

Travel time: 90-minute drive You don't need to go far to swap concrete blocks for trees and wildflowers. One of the largest remaining wild woods in Western Europe, Hampshire's 120-square-mile New Forest is teeming with 3,000 native ponies, donkeys, deer and even rare species of fungi. Cycle or trek along tracks that run through the forest, or take a Canadian Canoe tour along the Beaulieu River to look for egret, kingfishers and curlews (£32pp, newforestactivities.co.uk).

Alternatively, trot back in time on a new horse-drawn carriage tour from Lyndhurst or Brockenhurst, stopping off for a pub lunch (from £25pp, brunswickcarriages.com).

A week's stay at Little Barn (sleeps two) in Emery Down, near Lyndhurst, costs from £525 in June. Visit newforestcottages.co.uk

Bath

Travel time: 140-minute drive Ditch the car and drift along some of the most scenic waterways in England and Wales on a canal boat holiday. There are 2,000 miles of canals and river flows to explore, but one of the easiest sections for first-time boaters runs along the Kennet and Avon Canal. Start in Bath, and continue six hours down the River Avon to Bristol Floating Harbour, or head east along a lock-free stretch to Bradford on Avon. Drifters (drifters.co.uk; 0844 984 0322) offer a four-day canal holiday for £875 from 10-13 July on a two-person boat. For more information on the waterways visit canalrivertrust.org.uk

SHORT-HAUL SUNSHINE

Guernsey Travel time: 30-minute flight from Gatwick It's unfairly earned a reputation for catering to a blue-rinse brigade, but this beach-blessed Channel Island also has a lot to offer younger, adventurous travellers. Clamber along the

rocky coastline in a helmet and wetsuit on a coasteering trip, or kayak between sandy coves on neighbouring Herm Island.

During July and August, Channel Islands Direct (channelislandsdirect. co.uk; 08444 937 095) offer a fivenight holiday from £399pp staying at the four-star St Pierre Park Hotel, just outside the capital St Peter Port, including breakfast and flights.

Time a visit between 30 July and 3 August, to tie in with the bizarre Scarecrow Trail in Torteval, where straw replicas of astronauts, vicars and even Michael Jackson pop up along an hour-and-a-half-long walking trail. Go to visitguernsey.com

Med Cruise from Genoa, Italy Travel time: two-hour flight

Ideal for indecisive travellers and anyone who prefers not to unpack their suitcase more than once, a cruise is a leisurely way to tick off multiple destinations. MSC Cruises hope to revive the glory days of glamorous sea travel on their 3,500person ship, MSC Preziosa, which dazzles with a Swarovski crystal staircase in its central atrium and an award-winning spa.

Corsica, France

Travel time: 130minute flight from Gatwick Although officially part of France for more than 200 years, this

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sophisticated island in the Mediterranean feels wildly different to the mainland. Boutique hotel Casa Theodora sits in hilltop village Muro, with very good access to many rugged

walking trails and fine wineries. The 16th-century property, with barrelvaulted ceilings and opulent frescoes, is named after Theodore von Neuhoff, who proclaimed himself King of Corsica in 1736. Swim at the nearby beaches of Balagne, or lounge by an indoor pool built in the original wine cellar.

Alicante, Spain

Travel time: 150-minute flight from Gatwick

Spain's Costa Blanca has always appealed to Brits abroad, and now several boutique hotels are raising the profile of the destination. Owned by former football player and manager Terry Venables, the recently opened Hotel La Escondida is tucked into the mountains north of Alicante, close to the Font Roja National Park. Built as a hunting lodge in 1881, the restored 500-acre estate still features heavy wooden beams and handpainted tiles. Guests can explore the national park on horseback or with bikes, while the beach is just a 30minute drive away.

Chamonix Valley, France

Travel time: 90-minute flight from Heathrow

As the highest mountain in the Alps, Mont Blanc has always been a holy grail for avid mountaineers. In 1865, during the golden age of mountaineering, there were an incredible 65 Alpine first ascents, including the famous Brenva-Spur.

Now, 150 years later, a series of

events are taking place in the Chamonix Valley to celebrate the anniversary of these historic climbs. Inghams (inghams.co.uk; 01483 791 114) offers seven nights half board at the Chalet Hotel Sapinière from £379pp, including flights on 10 June and transfers. As part of their stay, guests also receive free packed lunches and afternoon tea

MID-HAUL RELAXATION Fethiye, Turkey

Travel time: four-hour flight from Gatwick

Although tourist gulets (Turkish yachts) pile in from April to October, Fethiye's natural harbour on Turkey's Turquoise Coast is still one of the most scenic and culturally-rich spots in the country. The Hellenistic theatre by the main quay once belonged to the ancient city of Telmessos, while the nearby ghost town of Kayaköy, abandoned in the early 20th century, is also on the historical sightseeing circuit. But most people come here to explore the bay and sun-soaked islands, including the blue lagoon at Oludeniz.

The Yacht Classic Hotel overlooks the marina in Fethiye and has its own private waterfront, along with an adults-only swimming pool and Turkish spa.

Peloponnese, Greece

Travel time: 210-minute flight from Heathrow and 150-minute transfer from Athens

Informed by a belief the body should function as a unified organism, Hippocrates, the father of modern medicine, prescribed a combination of diet, gym, massage and sea bathing to fend off disease.

Had he been around a few millennia later, he'd have probably directed patients to Amanzoe, an exquisite property set high in hilly olive groves overlooking the silky Aegean Sea.

Travel time: 23-hour indirect flight from Heathrow

Packing jumpers and thermals for a summer holiday might not sound appealing, but June to September is the best period to access High Arctic regions. One Ocean Expeditions are running a special 11-day Arctic Circle in Focus: Photography Symposium, combining the Canadian Arctic with the west coast of Greenland.

Villas and an infinity pool look out to the Andaman Sea, while tropical forest hugs the remainder of

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the resort.

Travel time: 630-minute indirect flight from Heathrow Lions may be declining in Africa as a whole but in the Maasai Mara prides are exploding in number, and with the annual wildebeest migration soon to start there's set to be even more action on the plains.

As well as channeling money directly to local Maasai landowners, conservancies (community-owned land near the reserves) also provide guests with some of the very best wildlife-viewing opportunities.

Positioned in a game-filled valley in one of the Mara's youngest conservancies, Naboisho, the exceptional sixtented Valley Camp employs some of Kenya's best-trained guides who know every big cat in the area by name. The camp opens on 1 June, and is currently offering a deal to stay four nights and pay for three. Prices from £1,443 per night, including meals, activities and transfers.
