

What's Biting



Plenty of options for fishing in September. For Redfish and Trout try drifting the shallow (1ft.) water behind the clinker islands (TS-51 on the Top Spot Map). This is within easy kayak distance from the fish camp and extends all the way down to haulover canal (TS-44). Pigfish, cut mullet or Grandslam artificial baits.

Shotgun Flats (TS-55), on the back side of Shotgun channel (TS-56), there are a couple of places to get there from kayak, but from boat hit it from the open water and pole up. Try to find a place where the water is moving and fish the edge with some cut or live bait or fish some topwater artificial baits early in the morning for some spectacular strikes.

your last one. Those are some very nice Redfish and Trout. You



also finessed a pretty nice flounder out of the lagoon, nice touch! Between you and your hubby, I hope you left a few for the rest of us, haha.

There have been plenty of bait holding in both of the canals on either side of the fish camp. You can usually catch as much bait as you need for a great day of live bait fishing.



A great thing to bring for kids is a cast net. They can haul up some nice bait while having a blast finding all kinds of sea life. Every cast is like a box of chocolates, you never know what you are going to get.
